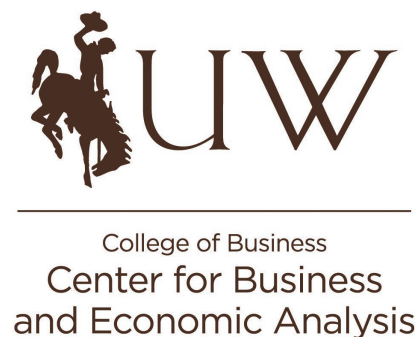

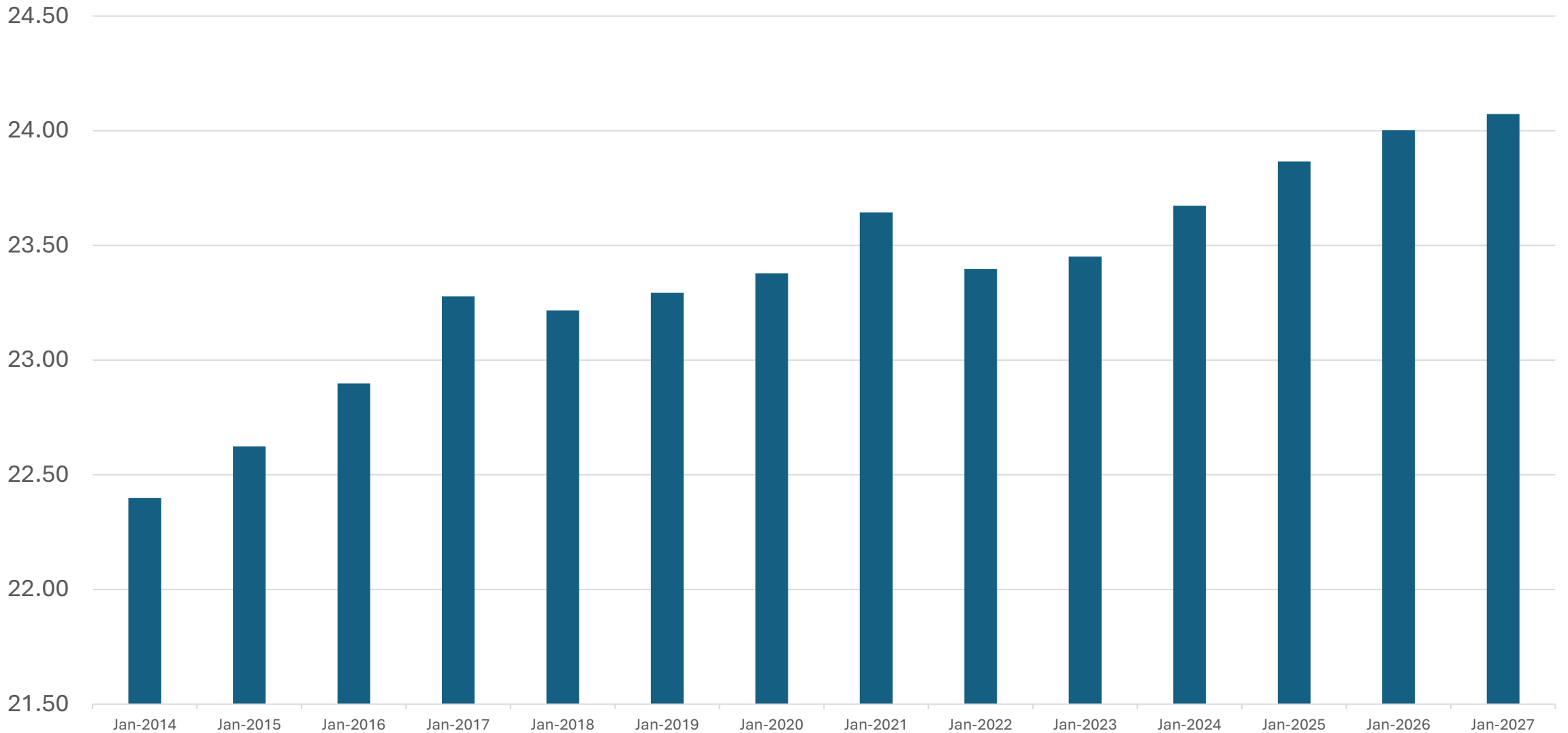

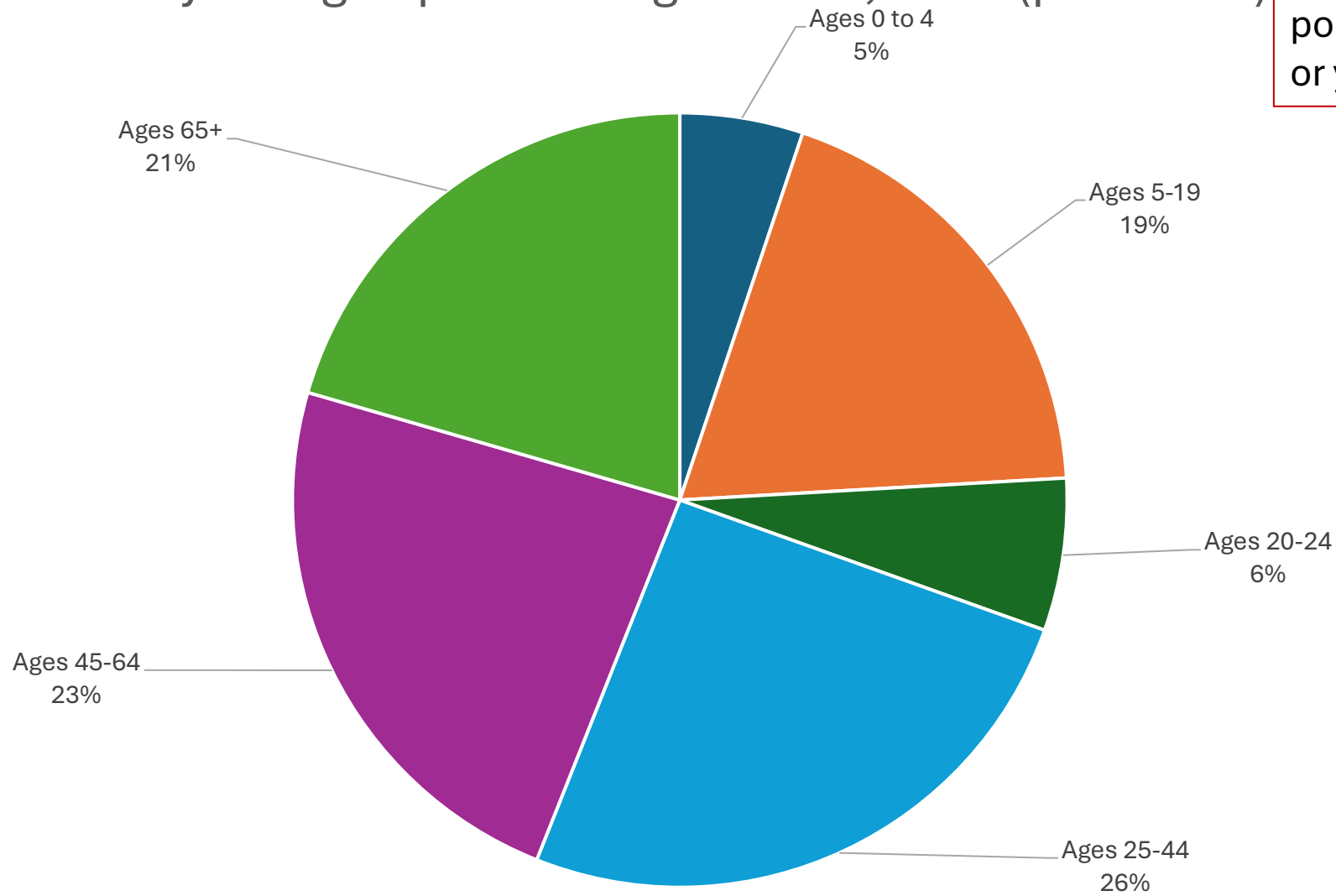

## Wyoming Population Age Profile, 2025 (predicted)

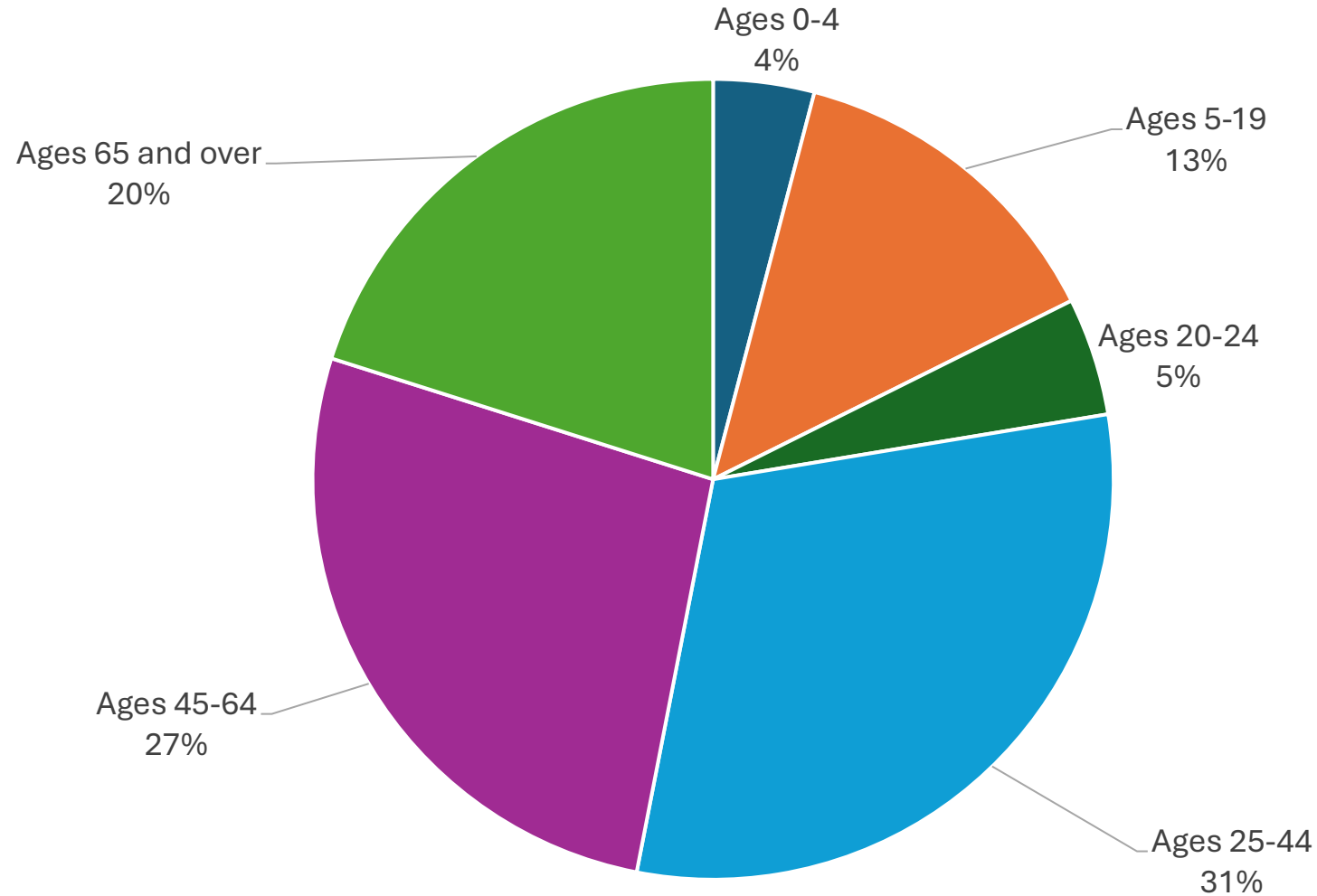


56% of Wyo's population is 44 or younger.

55% of Wyo's population is prime working age (20-64).



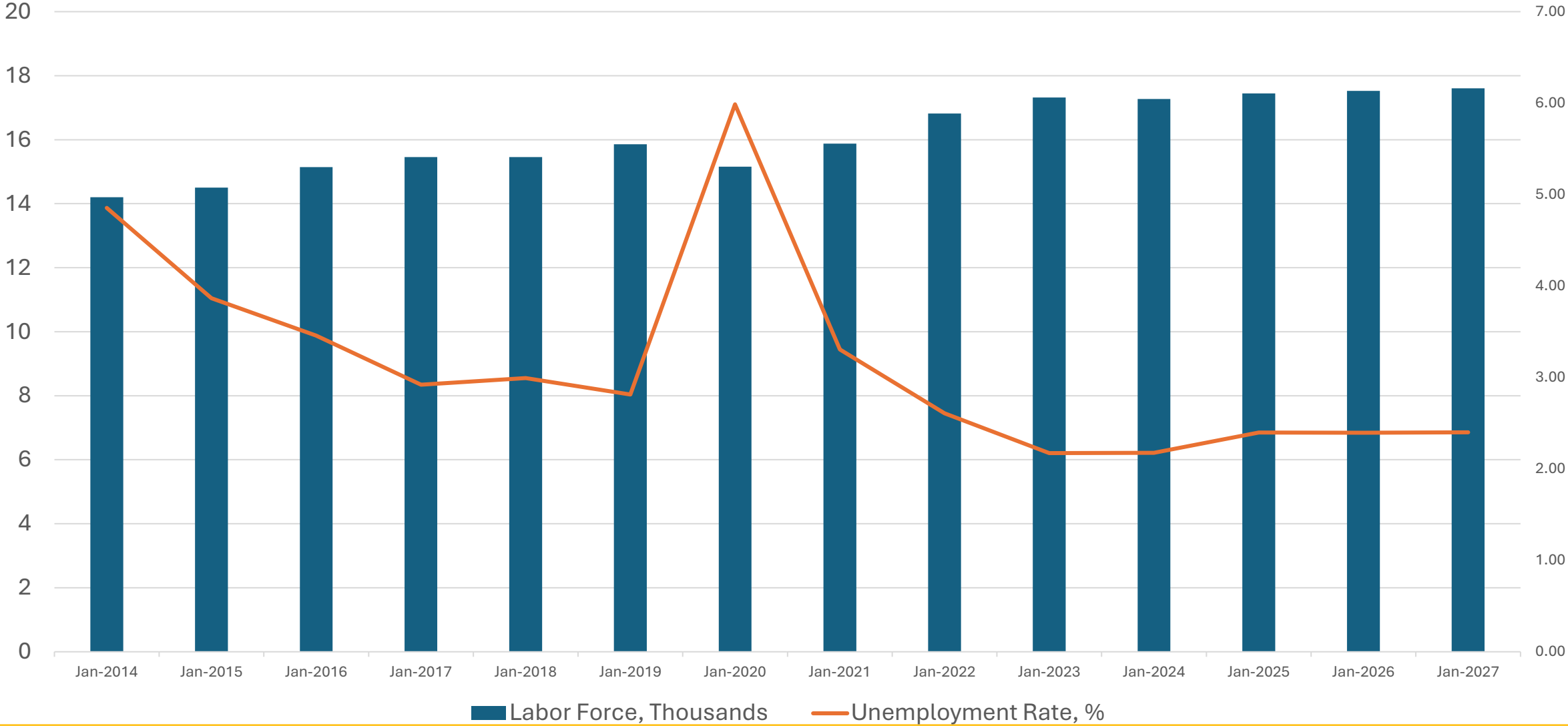
## Teton County, Population Age Profile, 2025 (predicted)



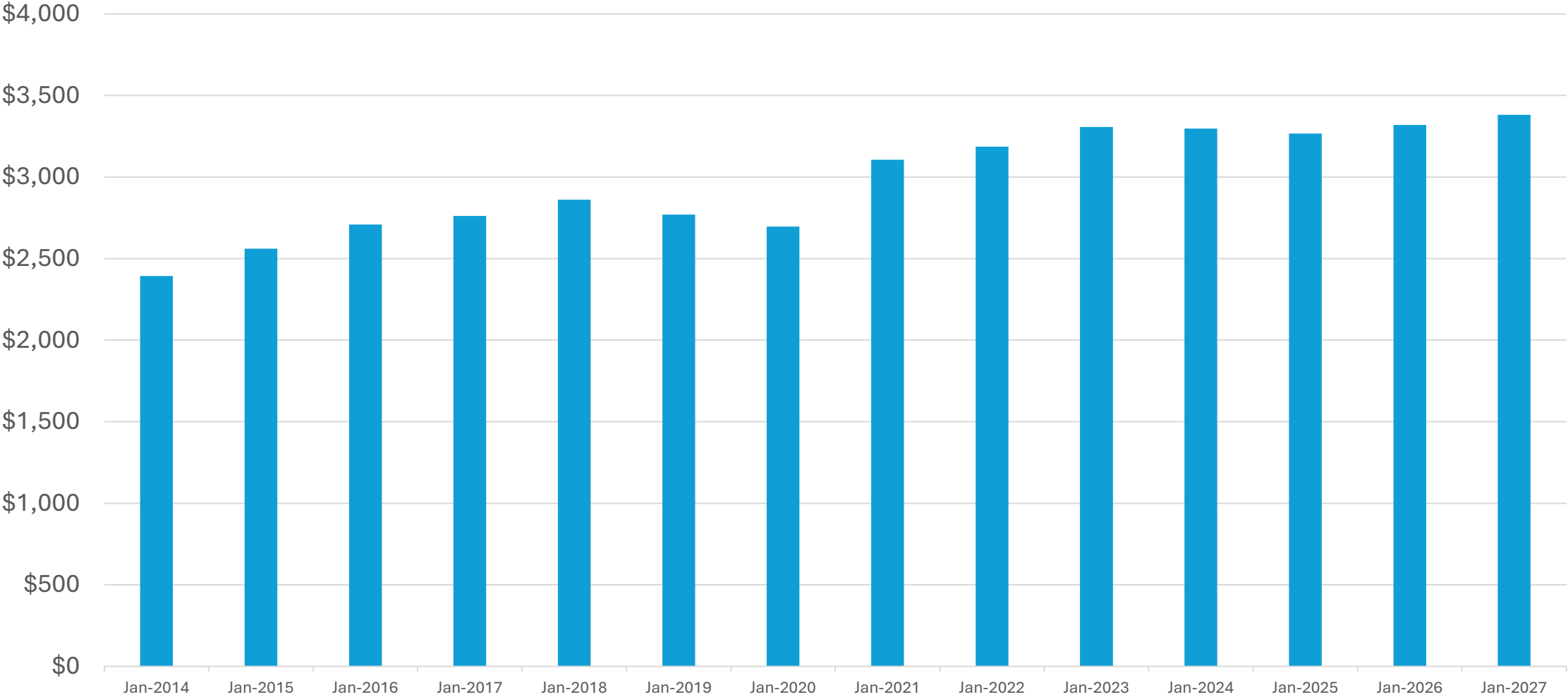
53% of Teton County's population is 44 or younger.

63% of Teton County's population is prime working age (20-64 years old)

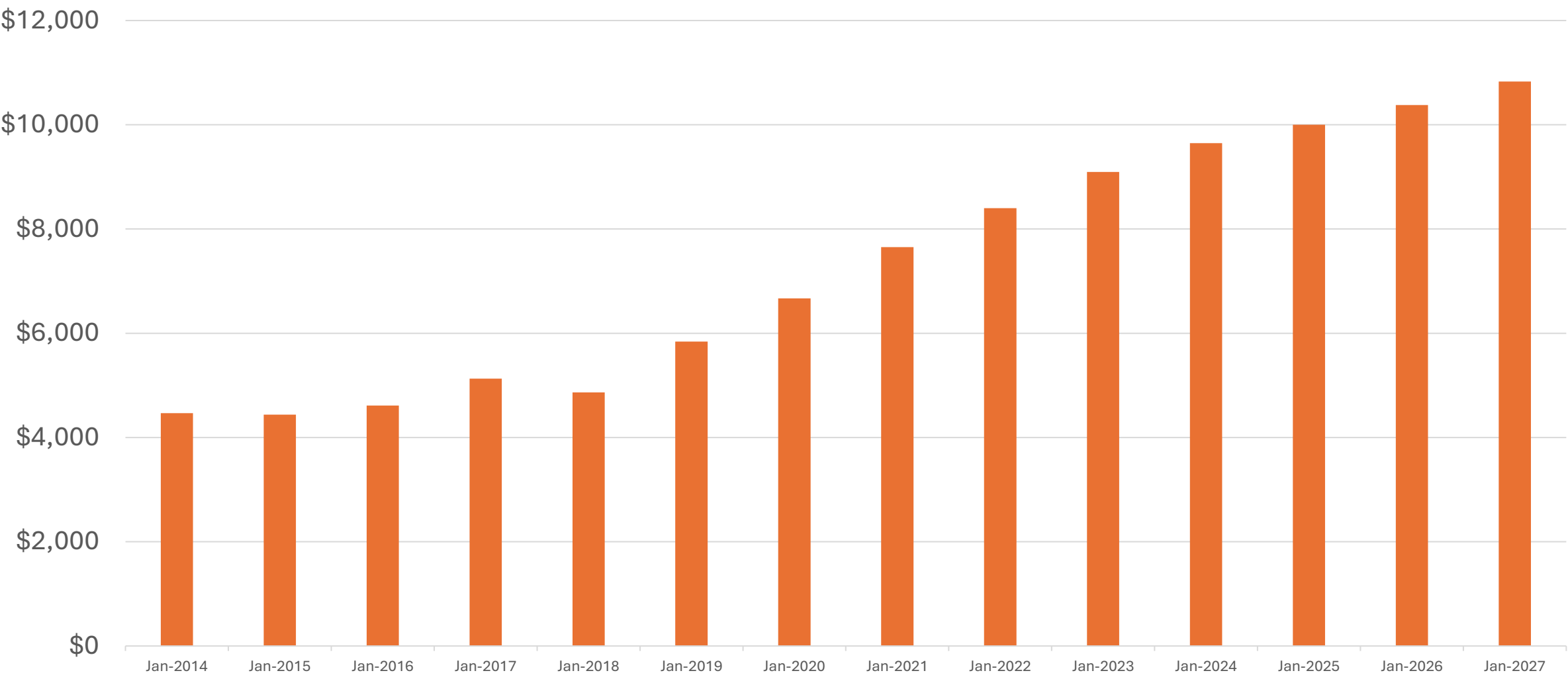
Teton County Labor Force and Unemployment Rate, 2014-2027 (predicted)



Teton County Inflation-Adjusted Gross County Product, Millions of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)

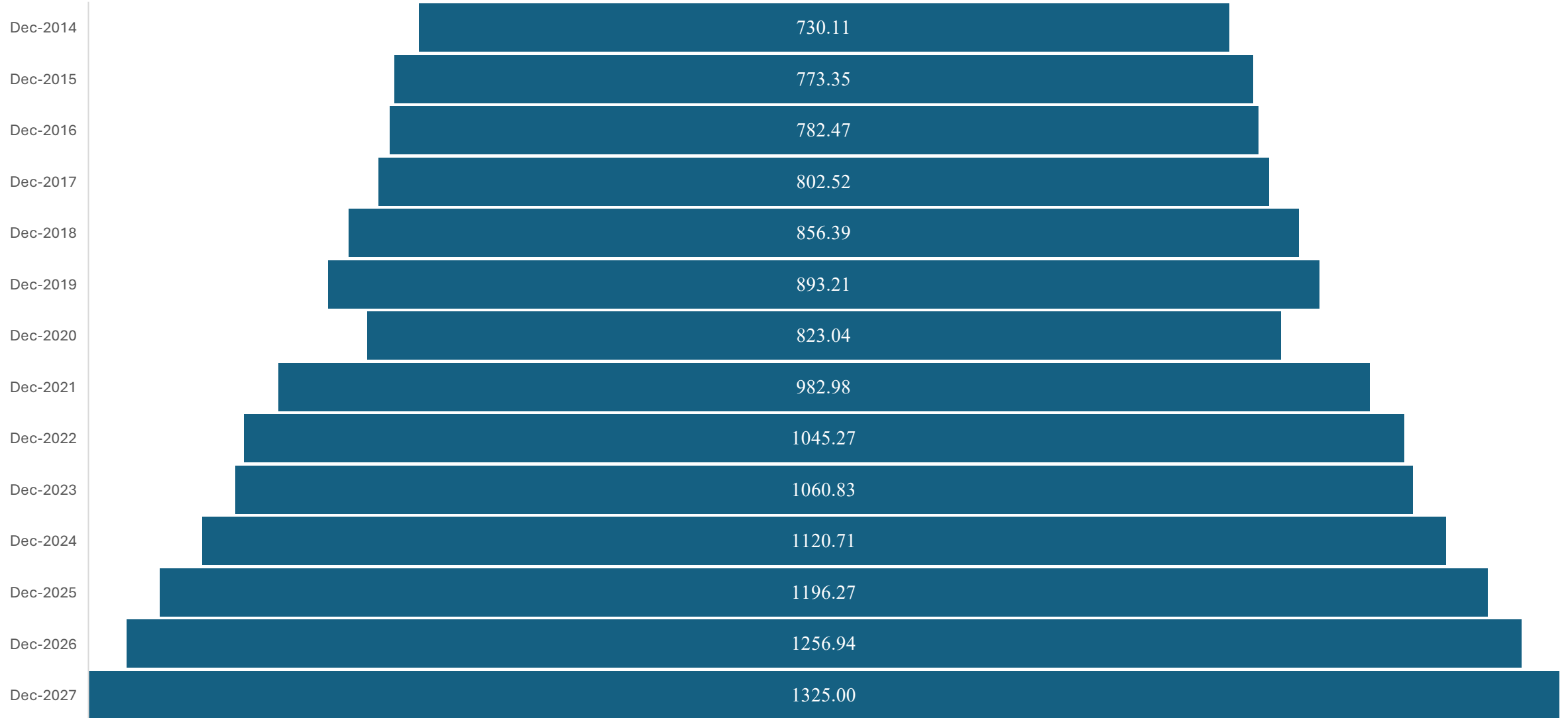


Teton County Inflation-Adjusted Total Personal Income, Millions of \$, 2014-2027  
(predicted)

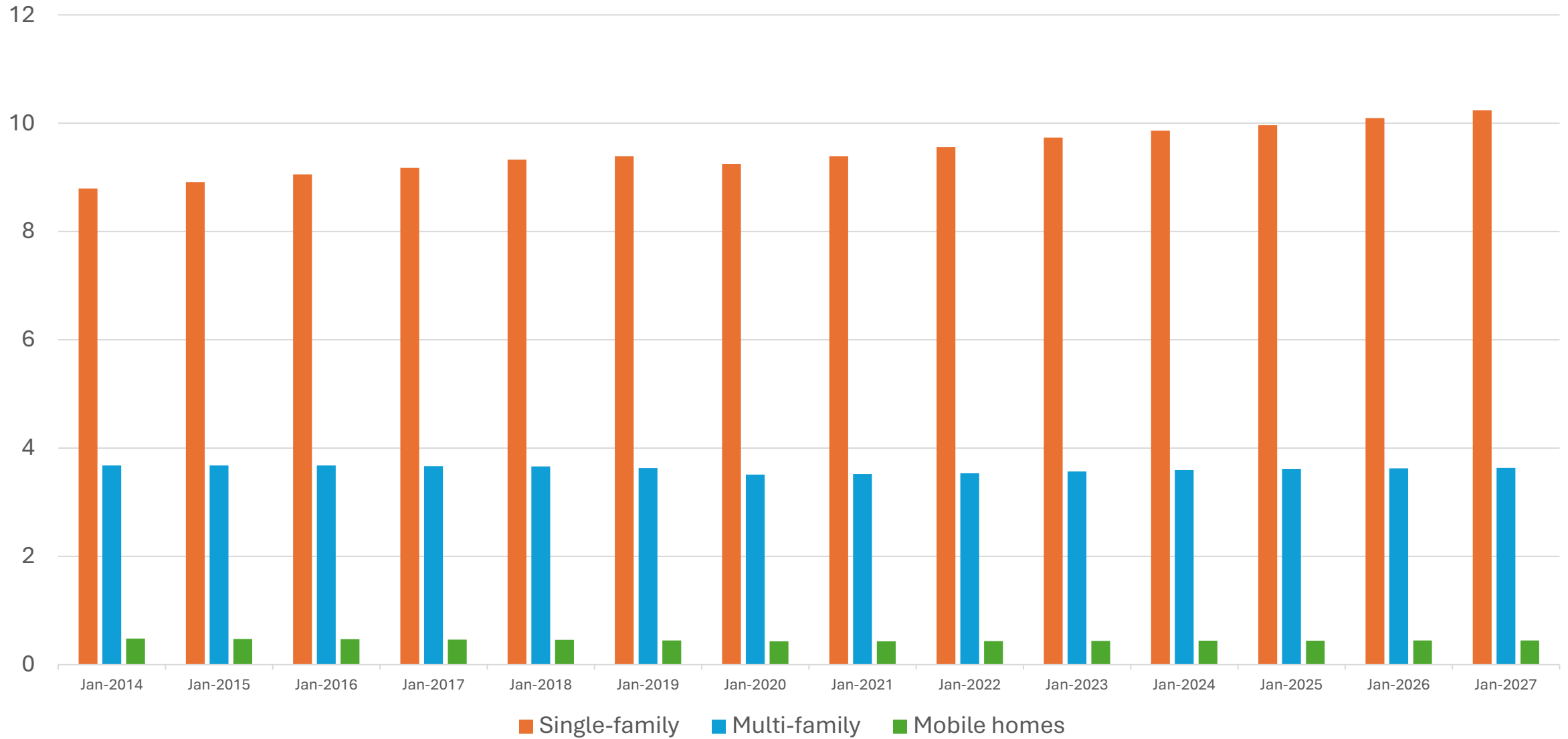




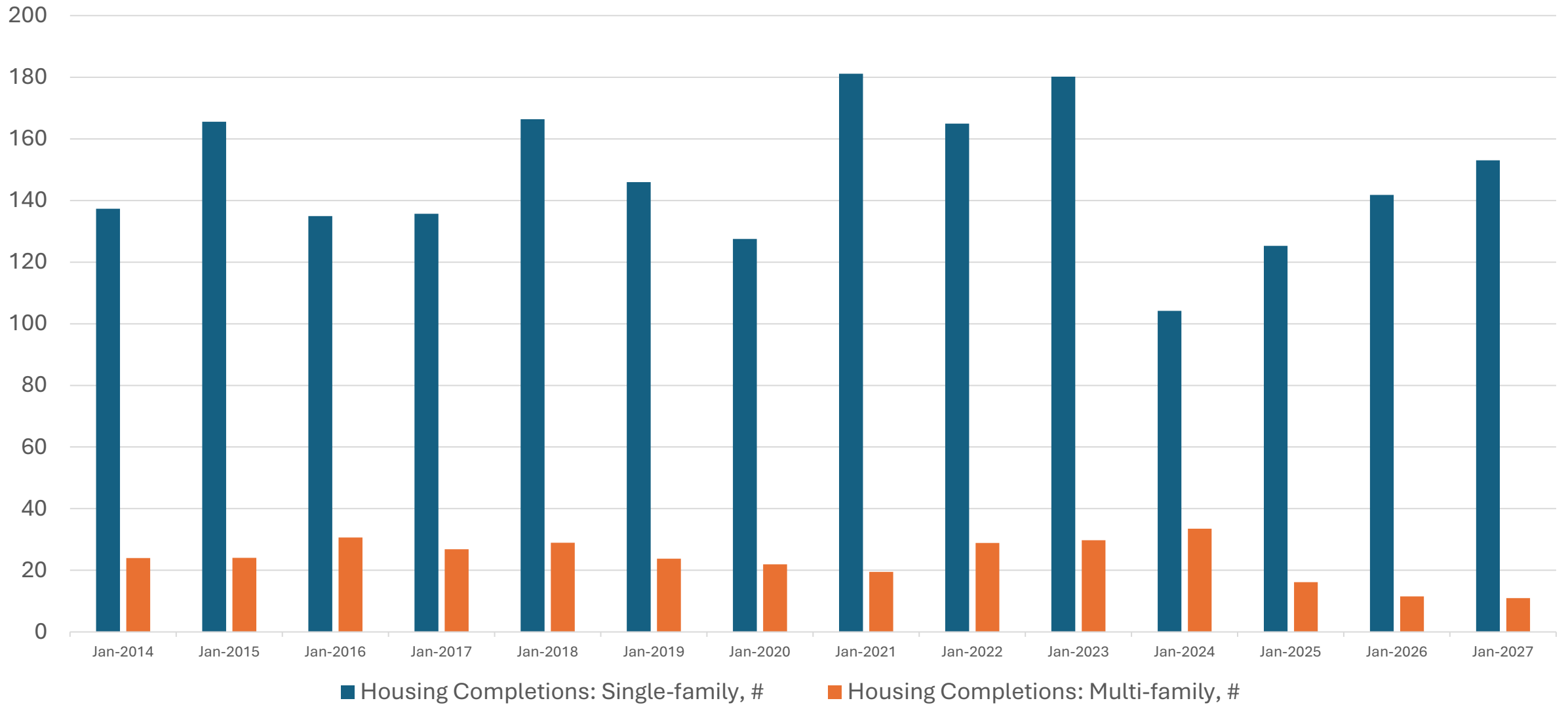
## Teton County, Total Retail Sales, Millions of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)



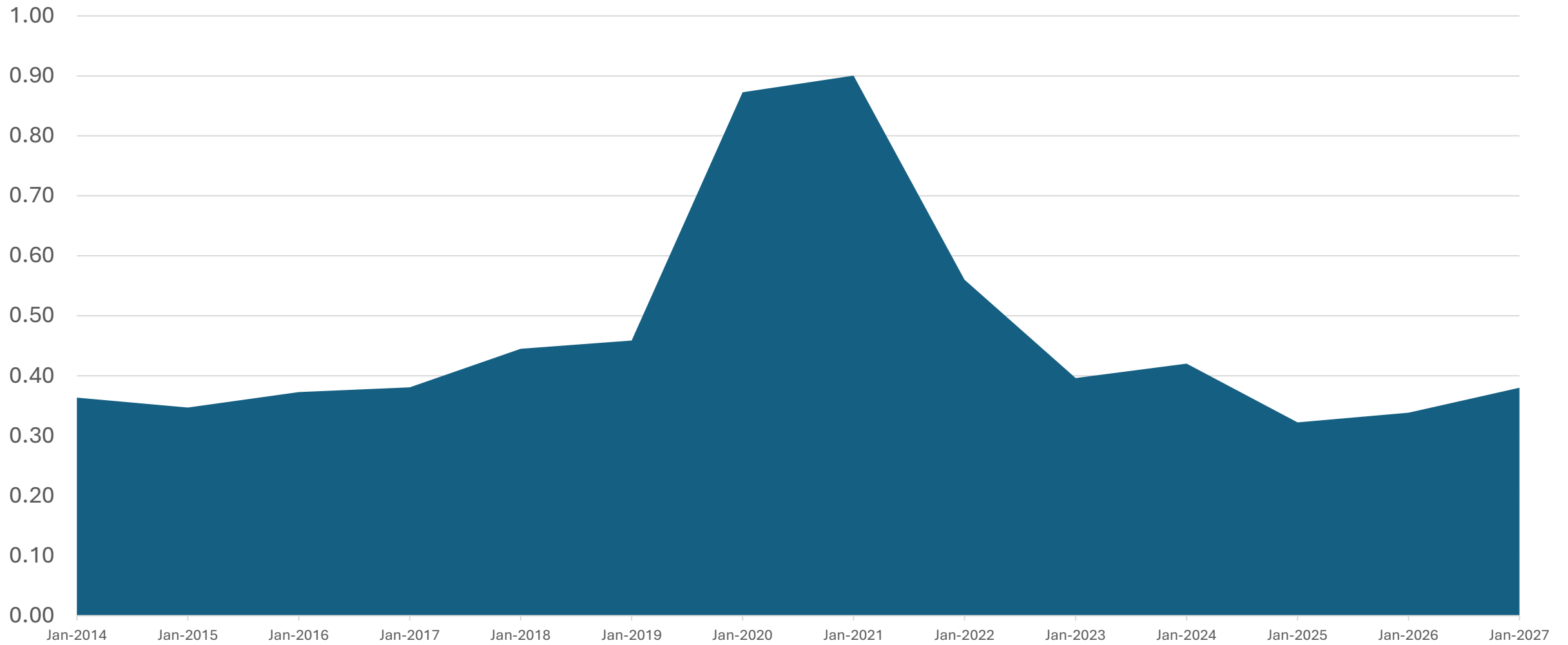
Teton County Housing Stock, Thousands of Units, 2014-2027 (predicted)



Teton County Housing Completions, #, 2014-2027 (predicted)

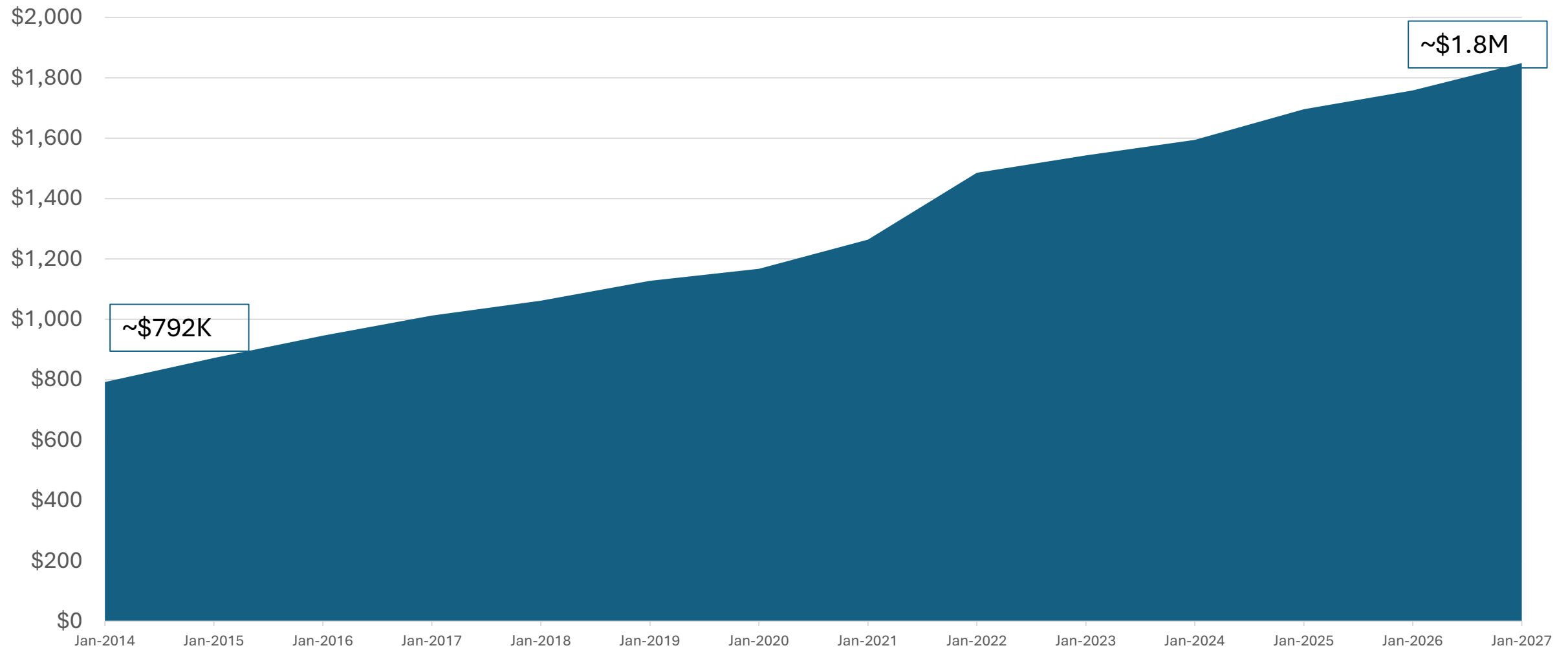


# Teton County Sales of Existing Single-family Homes, Thousands, 2014-2027 (predicted)

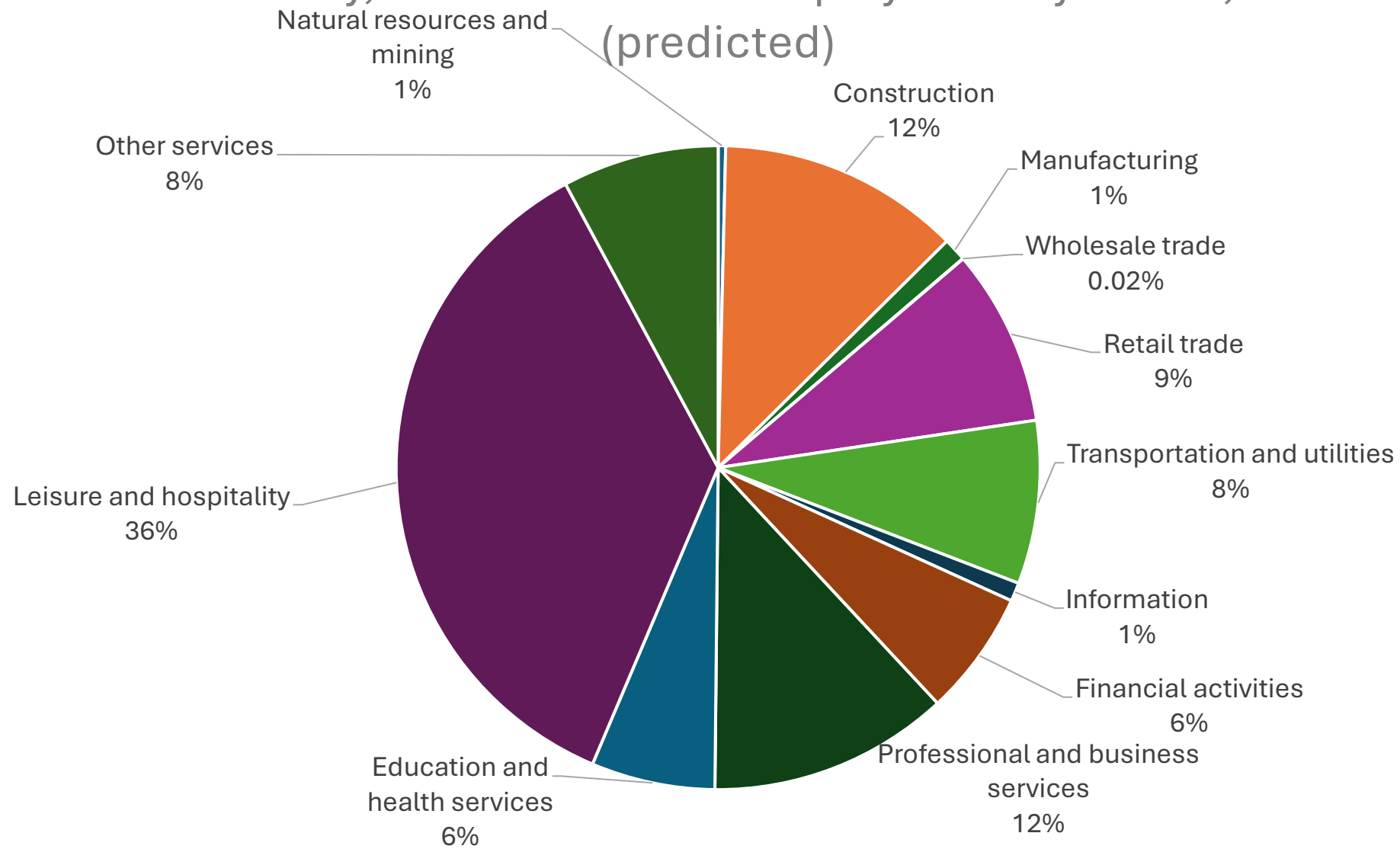




# Teton County Median Sales Price for Existing Existing Single-Family Homes, Thousands of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)
