






Teton County Population, Thousands of Persons, 2014-2017 (predicted)



Wyoming Population Age Profile, 2025 (predicted)




Teton County, Population Age Profile, 2025 (predicted)




53% of Teton County's population is 44 or younger.

63% of Teton County's population is prime working age (20-64 years old)


Teton County Labor Force and Unemployment Rate, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County Inflation-Adjusted Gross County Product, Millions of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County Inflation-Adjusted Total Personal Income, Millions of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County, Total Retail Sales, Millions of \$, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County Housing Stock, Thousands of Units, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County Housing Completions, #, 2014-2027 (predicted)




Teton County Sales of Existing Single-family Homes, Thousands, 2014-2027 (predicted)
